Player Reminders and Tournament Rules

1. USTA rules and The Code of Conduct shall govern all play, except as modified with these rules. Point Penalty System will be in effect. Penalties may be issued by the tournament director, by a committee member and USTA Officials. Only USTA Official will be used for the Junior matches.
2. Warm-up time is strictly limited to ten (10) minutes.
3. Split-set matches, except finals, will be decided by a 10-point super tie-breaker. All final matches will be best two-out-of-three sets.
4. If you enter 3 events, you must be prepared to play one Friday match.
5. If you enter 1 or 2 events, you will receive a minimum of 30 minutes after a doubles match before your next match and a minimum of 60 minutes after a singles match. If you enter 3 events, you will receive a minimum of 30 minutes before your next match regardless of whether the match you played is singles or doubles.
6. Event entry (other than age group events) is by NTRP/UTR rating. If you have questions, National Tennis Rating Program guidelines are available online at www.usta.com.
7. Players may enter ONE (1) singles event, ONE (1) doubles event and ONE (1) mixed doubles event.
8. Players entering three events must be able to play Friday, 5 p.m. or later, as well as Saturday and Sunday.
9. A-B-C Divisions are based on NTRP/UTR ratings as follows:
A: NTRP 4.0+ - UTR 7.50+ B: NTRP 2.5-3.5 – UTR 5.01 – 7.49 C: NTRP 2.5 – UTR 5.0 or less
10. In doubles events, highest player on a team must use their NTRP/UTR rating for the event entered.
Example: Player X is a 4.0 player and player Y is a 3.0 player, they would enter the A division event.
11. The committee reserves the right to re-rate any player at its discretion.
12. The tournament draw will be posted online Thursday, by 6 p.m. To find your first match times you can go to our website at www.kenhuffclas.org at 6 p.m. Thursday.
13. The committee reserves the right to consolidate divisions based upon the number of entries and to use a round-robin format if necessary for any division,
14. The tournament director reserves the right to reduce or reschedule matches as required in case of extenuating circumstances and to use no-ad scoring, short-sets, as well as either 7-point or 10-point tie breaker sets. "In the tie-break, players or teams will change ends of the court after every 6 points."
15. ADULT age group events are open to all players who have reached or will reach the minimum age limit of the division (40, 50 or 60) on or before December 31, 2018. JUNIOR age group events use the "month of birth" rule. Junior players in the 12, 14, 16 and 18 groups may play in that division until the month they turn 13, 15, 17 or 19. Example: If you are to turn 13 any time in the month of July 2018, you would play in the 14U age group.
16. No coaching, either verbally or by signals of any kind, is permitted except during any authorized suspension of play (change overs and end of sets are NOT suspension of play). Violation of this rule renders the player subject to penalty points, including disqualification of the player.
17. It is the responsibility of the player to ascertain the starting time of his/her matches, including any changes due to weather or other delays. Draws will be posted at www.kenhuffclas.org.
18. It will be the obligation of the tournament director and her assistants to monitor play and to enforce all rules, regulations, including The Code; to assess penalty points against any player for unsportsmanlike conduct during the matches, such conduct to include, but not be limited to: Time Violations (unreasonable delays after the warm up period, delay between points and changing ends); Un-sportsmanship Acts (violently or with anger hitting, kicking or throwing a tennis ball, racket or any other equipment; Verbal Abuse (Loud, profane or abusive language); Visible obscenity; Receiving Coaching from anyone (except your doubles partner when playing with them), including a parent or other accompanying person; or Cheating.
19. The use of the following Point Penalty System will be enforced by the tournament director and his assistants. The following is the schedule for Code Violation during a match (not cumulative matches):
First offense: Point B. -Second offense: Game C. -Third offense: Default
